AANP Centennial Meeting Review

The AANP held its Centennial Meeting this summer, in Olympic Valley, CA, which offered a stunning backdrop with mountain scenery and endless natural beauty. Held June 5th – June 9th, the meeting format allowed for both live and virtual attendees and was able to welcome a record 603 participants. There were 448 participants onsite and 155 virtual attendees. The Centennial Meeting provided an opportunity for in-person and virtual networking, with colleagues, trainees and other leaders in the field.

The AANP hosted three ancillary meetings on Wednesday, June 5th. All three of the meetings were beneficial to participants and very well attended. This year, each ancillary meeting was recorded so individuals who were unable to attend the live session were able to review the recordings after the meeting. Additionally, Eddie Lee, MD, PhD, hosted the AANP Scholars Workshop, *Navigating Academic Neuropathology: Positions and Grants*, which is funded by a grant through the National Institute on Aging via an R13 Support for Scientific Conferences grant.

The Centennial Meeting officially kicked off on Thursday, June 6th, with the Special Course organized by Eddie Lee, MD, PhD, titled *Reflecting Backward While Marching Forward*, welcoming an exceptional faculty.

Presented throughout the meeting were the Named Lecture speakers. Friday held the *Parisi Lecture* titled, *Viral Infections, Cognitive Impairments, and Neurodegeneration: Lessons from HIV*, with speaker Susan Morgello, MD; and the *DeArmond Lecture* on *Genetic Analysis of Parkinsonism*, by Mel Feany, MD, PhD. The *Korey Lecture*, titled, *Why the Microscope Still Matters*, presented by Craig Horbinski, MD, PhD, was on Saturday. Lastly, Sunday held the *Moore Lecture*, on *Advanced Intraoperative Histologic Imaging Techniques*, with speaker Sandra Camelo-Piragua, MD.

Friday hosted the scientific platform sessions 1-4, and held the *Meritorious Award* presentations to Dr. David Louis, Dr. Virgina Lee, and Dr. Cheryl Palmer. The scientific sessions continued on Saturday, with platforms 5-8, and also included the *What Every Neuropathologist Needs to Know Lectures: Update on NeuroID Workups, Consultation Resources*, by Isaac Solomon, MD, PhD and *AI in Diagnostic and Research Neuropathology*, by John Crary, MD-PhD.

Friday night also included the Centennial Meeting Gala, hosted by President Rebecca Folkerth, MD. It was a grand celebration of a century of groundbreaking advancements in the field. The event brought together esteemed professionals, researchers, and clinicians to honor the progress made in the field of neuropathology. Held in an elegant setting, the gala featured keynote addresses from Dr. Jack Lee (*JNEN* Editor-in-Chief) and Dr. Daniel Perl and included a "memories" open mic moderated by Dr. Melissa Blessing and Dr. Craig Horbinski. The evening also provided opportunities for networking, fostering collaboration among the brightest minds in the field, while reflecting on the legacy and future of neuropathology. It was capped off by a great night of dancing and music.

Sunday ended the meeting with *Presidential Symposium*, directed by Rebecca Folkerth, MD. The symposium included Dr. Folkerth's session, *Cross-pollination between Forensic and Academic Neuropathology Practices for Research, Brain-Banking, and Enhanced Education*. Additionally, Dan Milner, MD, MSc(Epi), MBA spoke about *Fostering Training and Practice Guidelines for Underserved Areas and Developing Countries*, Cheryl Palmer, MD discussed, *Neuropathology Outreach in Ghana and Ethiopia*, and Nicole Jackson, MD, MPH, presented *Tapping the Wellspring of Diversity for the Next Century*.

Memories, timelines, posters, and scrolling pictures throughout the meeting provided an excellent history of the AANP and now we look forward to the next 100 years!

Diagnostic Slide Session

The 65th Annual *Diagnostic Slide Session* was held on the evening of Saturday, June 8, 2024, at the 100th Annual Meeting. Eleven cases were presented, chosen from 56 submissions covering a wide spectrum array of pathology including tumoral, infectious, congenital/developmental, vascular, neurodegenerative, muscle, pituitary and nerve and ophthalmic pathology.

The 66th Annual *Diagnostic Slide Session* is scheduled to occur during the 101st Annual Meeting in Minneapolis, MN. The deadline for case submissions for the

Annual Business Meeting

The following committee updates provide a high-level overview of what was presented at the June 7, 2024, Annual Business Meeting.

Awards Committee

The Awards Committee met during the Annual Meeting to determine the award winners, which are listed above on pages 3-6:

- Moore Award (Best paper on Clinico-Pathological Correlation)
- Rubinstein Award (Best paper on Neuro-oncology)
- Weil Award (Best paper on Experimental Neuropathology)
- Hirano Award (neurodegenerative diseases)
- Terry Award (neurodegenerative diseases)

The committee implemented a large screen TV and laptop to navigate to virtual posters for better viewing in poster-presentation room this year. Moving forward they would like to explore the inclusion of a recording of a summary of the poster for the virtual posters.

Constitution & Bylaws Committee

There were no proposed changes or actions items to consider this year to the Bylaws Amendments or Constitution Amendments. The committee will continue to maintain the Constitution and the Bylaws as usable guides to govern the affairs of the Association.

Education Committee

The Education Committee continues to focus on the new Molecular Neuropathology Course, Educational Opportunities webpage, AANP Teaching Rounds, ancillary meetings, and annual meeting planning and accreditation. A call for applications for ancillary meetings, will take place in March of 2025 for the 2026, 102nd Annual Meeting.

Membership Committee

At the 2024 Annual Meeting, the Membership Committee Chair, John DeWitt, MD, PhD, provided updates regarding AANP membership. It was a successful year as there was a year over year increase in total members (2.2%), active members (0.6%), junior members (9.8%), and senior members (2.0%). The total number of AANP members is 831 in 2024, up from 813 in 2023. The breakdown includes: 471 Active members, 3 Associate members, 101 Junior members, and 255 Senior members. Junior membership

increased to 101 in 2024 from 92 in 2023. Additionally, Dr. DeWitt provided updates regarding new applicants and status changes:

- o 19 New Active Members; 0 New Associate Members; 31 New Junior Members
- 16 Junior transitioned to Active
- 5 Active transitioned to Senior
- o 2 Active to Junior
- 0 Deceased Member Reports
- A list of all new and transitioning members was presented to the membership

The Membership Committee continues to focus on transitioning Junior members to Active membership. Additionally, after the Annual Meeting, Dr. DeWitt rolled off as the committee chair. Nathan Clement, MD is the new chair for the committee.

NP Fellowship Program Directors Committee

During this year's Annual Meeting, the NP Fellowship Program Directors Committee hosted the trainee luncheon, "Combining Additional Fellowships with Neuropathology". Throughout the year, the committee will focus on reviewing the following:

- NP Fellowship Structure Survey Results
- Proposal for new AP Boards timing (after PGY2)
- New Program requirements established by ACGME
- Fellowship interview format (virtual vs. in-person)
- ABPath and Cooperating Societies meeting focus on Fellow Training Modules/competency-based assessment

Additionally, the committee would like to identify ways to introduce competency-based assessments as the ACGME will now require that fellow evaluation includes competency assessment. Areas of success for the NP Fellowship Program Directors Committee included a 93% Board pass rate for 2023, which was an increase from previous years, and the maintenance of the Neuropathology Fellowship and Jobs Board webpages. These pages on the website continue to serve as a hub for prospective and current trainees and are updated regularly.

Program Committee

Each year, the AANP Program Committee is responsible for review and selection of abstracts for presentation as well as selecting the travel awards including the AANP, Richard Davis, and ISN Travel Awards. This year the AANP, in conjunction with R13 grant funding, had the honor of selecting the standard awards for abstract submitters, as well as 15 R13 Trainee Travel Awards and 15 Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Travel Awards. Overall, 328 abstracts were submitted in 2024. In 2023, there were 247 abstracts submitted, and in 2021 there were 211 abstracts submitted.

The Program Committee is continually working to make the abstract submission process as seamless as possible, as well as the review process for the Program Committee. Cadmium will continue to be the platform utilized as the abstract submission site.

Website Committee

The Website Committee continues to manage the AANP website including making regular updates to the Jobs and NP Fellowship webpages, the Educational page inclusive of opportunities such as AANP Teaching Rounds and the 2024 Molecular Neuropathology Course, and the announcements page. Throughout the year they have managed the cloud-based membership software, MemberClicks, the Community Forum, and AANP social media accounts. Website Committee members continue to work to engage the neuropathology and general pathology communities via Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Instagram, and the Community Forum. Additionally, they assist with the AANP's learning management system, BlueSky. The committee has focused on joint efforts with the education committee including the central list of educational conferences, available on the website.

Archivist Report

The Centennial Meeting Archives Group met in Dallas in March 2024 to scour archives for items and information that could be presented at the Centennial Meeting. From that material, the group did a phenomenal job of preparing posters and media presentations (including a display case with historical artifacts) that attendees thoroughly enjoyed throughout the meeting. Additionally, the group, in collaboration with *JNEN*, produced the *AANP Centennial Meeting Yearbook*. This will be made available to all registered attendees (onsite and virtual). Once available, those that did not register for the meeting will be able to purchase.

The committee would like to continue digitizing existing archives and create digital documents that are suitable for public dissemination in a searchable format. They are currently researching best options for data storage and access.

During the Annual Meeting, Dr. Lee shared the following statistics with members:

The JNEN continues to focus on recruiting relevant review articles as well as more AANP members to submit. They are focusing on co-marketing JNEN with other neuroscience journals and assigning original articles for Open Access. They are on track for 30 Open Access articles in 2024.
