AANP 101st Annual Meeting

The AANP is looking forward to the 101st Annual Meeting which will take place June 19-22, 2025, and will again be a hybrid meeting! The meeting is set to occur in Minneapolis, MN at the Hyatt Regency Minneapolis, while the virtual live-stream portion will be hosted via the vendor *Blue Sky eLearn*.

The 101st Meeting features a one-day *Special Course* that will consist of two components, Part 1: "New CNS WHO Entities and Impact on Patient Care," and Part 2: "Novel Technologies and Their Impact in Neuropathology." This will be followed by two days of scientific sessions (platform and poster) in which members present original research, an evening *Diagnostic Slide Session*, and a half-day *Presidential Symposium* titled, "Brain Stem Cells in Health and Disease."

This year the AANP is pleased to offer three ancillary meetings on Wednesday, June 18. Registrants for the 101st Annual Meeting are eligible to register and attend one meeting in person as the meetings occur concurrently. There is no additional fee to register for an ancillary meeting. Please note that two of the meetings have attendance caps due to room capacity. The meetings will NOT be live streamed; however, recordings of the audio and slides will be made available to all registered attendees following the 101st Annual Meeting and will be available through September 30, 2025.

AANP Fall 2024 Membership Survey

The <u>AANP Fall 2024 Membership Survey</u>, conducted between mid-October through late November of 2024, was completed by 116 AANP members. Responses drive AANP development of educational activities, including Annual Meeting content, and help document professional practice gaps and subsequent areas of education need, which is an ACCME requirement for accredited CE. The survey is <u>NOT</u> a test; instead, it is a tool to illuminate topics or areas for which education might be appropriate.

The primary focus of the survey is clinical assertion statements which are developed by the Education Committee and focused on identified areas which change from year to year. This year the survey focused on the following topic areas:

- Complications of Amyloid Therapy
- Diagnosis of LATE (limbic-predominant age-related TDP-43 encephalopathy)
- Artificial Intelligence
- Eye Pathology
- Vascular Neuropathology
- Competency-based Medical Education
- Methylation-defined Diagnostic Entities in CNS Tumors


